THOUSAND OAKS, Calif.-Senior Deputy Labor Commissioner Dan Cornet will partner with Nordman Cormany Hair & Compton LLP attorney Lou Cappadona to speak on state wage and hour laws at "Ask the Labor Commissioner." The half-day seminar, presented by the East Ventura County Employer Advisory Council (EAC), will be held 7:30 a.m.-noon, May 16, at the Palm Garden Hotel, 495 North Ventu Park Rd., Thousand Oaks.

"Most employers have questions about the ever-changing laws governing employment," Cappadona said. "This seminar is a great opportunity for local employers to get answers about state wage and hour law directly from the labor commissioner."

Some of the topics will include meal and rest period rules, the Private Attorney General Act of 2004, qualifications for an exempt employee and a consultant or independent contractor, temporary and part-time employees, daily and weekly overtime, alternative work schedules, employee rights, time card requirements in the electronic age, paycheck deductions and rules for the final paycheck.
