Land use Attorney Nancy Kierstyn Schreiner gave us an in-depth understanding of a new state land use bill—SB3005—that mandates counties to update their General Plans to facilitate so-called Transit Oriented Development. This means clustering more development near transportation hubs. Good luck in the S. Coast where we now have 3 train stations, Goleta, SB, and Carpinteria for weekday commuter trains, but little attempt to encourage residential-commercial development around them.

Winds of Change
